In discussion of priorities and what we would like to include in the 2025 budget, board members mentioned:	president
<ul> <li>Staffing, and/or moving to rely more on volunteers, to relieve Jorim of rentals and facilities work not in the administrator job description</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Would like to make hospitality a budget priority. If groups know that snacks and childcare are always available, it's easier for people to volunteer and meet. Also, we need a Hospitality Team to run the coffee hour (and wash dishes, so we don't end up paying Frank to as we have lately)</li> </ul>	
• The Tech Team needs beefing up We may need to put some money into hiring contractor to make our website and calendar more plug-&-play.

EJA proposal to raise funds for heat pump	Тот
Tom explained that the heat pump project began three years ago, when the Board asked Stefan to make a plan to replace natural gas in our building (including our seven or eight furnaces and a gas water heater). We also have need to heat the third floor of the East Wing and to stop heat leaks from Hamilton Hall.	
Energy rates have increased and will continue doing this. We need to take a fresh look at what the savings from transitioning off gas would be.	
There are government incentives (rebates) available for solar, but not for heat pumps. The best quote we got for the third-floor heat pump project as \$10K more than what's in the current budget (and what the cost was expected to be), so EJA would like to raise funds for it.	
Janet: The electricity for my heat pump at my small home is very expensive.	
Dave: We are still waiting for the current budget vs. actual spending information, which we need to make decisions on 2025 budget and spending on heat pump.	
MOTION to table the issue of funding the heat pump project until the Board has the financial information needed to plan 2025 budget (Nicole, 2nd Dennis) – PASSED	
Stewardship campaign planning (20 min)	Dave
Dave wants to start the campaign early, on Sep. 15th or 22nd. We (the Board, who is the Stewardship Team this year) need to start calling those who haven't gotten their new pledges in yet after a week. With nine Board members, each of us won't have to call more than ten people.

Dave suggests the basis for the 2025 budget be this year's (\$320,000) plus \$10,000 more for a staff COLA (cost-of-living adjustment).
